## A Meditation for You from Our Pastor

### GOD SPEAKS THROUGH HIS ACTIVITY

Look among the nations and watch--Be utterly astounded!

For I will work a work in your days

Which you would not believe, though it were told you.

HABAKKUK 1:5 (NKJV)

Christians habitually seek God's voice through prayer, though His word, or through His messengers. Yet sometimes we fail to hear God speak through His activity, even though He is working all around us. Unbelievers see God's activity without understanding what they see. God encourages His people to watch for His activity so they will know how they should respond and adjust their lives.

The disciples discovered much about God's power by witnessing Jesus calming a raging storm with a command. Seeing Jesus dine with the notorious sinner, Zacchaeus, taught them a poignant message about God's love for sinners. Watching Jesus hang upon the cross communicated a compelling message of what God was willing to do to free people from sin. Discovering the empty tomb revealed an astounding truth of God's victory over death. To those with spiritual discernment, God's activity is a significant revelation about His heart and His will.

If you are **sensitive** to what God is doing around you, **He will clearly speak to you through His activity**. **You will know that God is at work**, because what you see will astound you, and **human power and wisdom** will not explain it. If things happen that are direct answers to your prayers, **God is speaking to you**. When you experience events that surpass your understanding and ability, it may be that God is communicating a **critical message** to you.

If you want to hear God's voice, look around you to see what He is doing. When you are watching for God at work, what you will see will reveal His character, and you will have a fresh understanding of how to respond to Him. AMEN.

### TRUSTEE MINISTRY REPORT

**Greetings, Saints from your Trustees of Union Baptist Church**. We pray all is well with you and your family, and we look forward to fellowshipping with you again.

It seems we missed our 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarterly Conference and thought it only fair to bring you up-to-date and highlight some of what we have been up to. Please know the board meets monthly, and committee meetings are happening all the time.

We will start with **Property & Space**, which is under the direction of Sis. Portia Fuller. The water fountain, the 2<sup>nd</sup> pew where the Deaconesses sit, the outside door by Pastor's Office, and the heat control valves for Hays Hall have all been repaired. Thanks to Dea. Ed Phillips, the oven/range suppression system is also repaired. (Too bad we're not there to cook in the kitchen.) Thanks to Dea. Donald Darby and Pioneer Housing Board, there are quite a few new items in the church, including new seating in the pulpit. During February, 17 of our members completed Phase I of Union's Clean-up.

Thanks to Sis. Louise Stevenson and her team, there is a new phone system. We are no longer a "one-telephone-line" church.

The **Transportation Sub-committee**, under Dea. Craig is pleased to announce we have raised close to our church van goal.

The **Personnel Committee**, under Sis. Gwen Hall is finalizing a new Policy & Procedure Book with new guidelines on paid time off. Because of the Pandemic, there is no office staff working currently.

The **Cemetery Committee**, under Sis. Dorene Dillard, has truly been blessed. Some of this may be old to some and new to others. *Union Baptist*: We received: A Grant from Hamilton County that allowed us to clean out the inside of the property and will enable us to remove unreachable branches, and bushes; a matching Grant from Dr. Odell Owens; a Grant from Ohio Humanities for community awareness; and funds from GoFundMe, which is managed by The Union Foundation. The Union Foundation was also awarded a grant from the National Park Services. This grant is restricted to restoration of the outside of the building, restoration and repair of the fence, and restoration and repair of the headstones. City Council voted to take over the grass-cutting of Union Baptist Church just a few days before the Pandemic hit us. However, because of the Pandemic and the City's current financial condition, they are unable to assist us as planned. *United American*: Honey Suckle was removed from the Vault. Also, we now have a clearer picture of how United will be repaired.

If you did not see a board member's name mentioned above, it does not mean that they did not roll up their sleeves and join in the fun of working. Most members of our team wear more than one hat and are incredibly instrumental in helping to complete tasks. Their input is valued. God has provided us with many blessings. One of the greatest blessings is allowing us to serve.
