A Meditation for You from Our Pastor

The True Meaning of Easter

Satan had lied and tricked Adam and Eve into sinning, causing them to be cast out of the Garden of Eden and all of humanity to be separated from God, and condemned to Hell. Then God confronted Satan and told him that One of Eve's offspring would one day restore His people and that he, Satan, would be cast into a lake of fire. (Gen 3:15)

God loved mankind, so He sent His prophets to tell them that He would send a Savior, the Messiah, or "Anointed One." The Messiah arrived in the form of a baby, and His name was Jesus. Jesus had been given an assignment by God to save the world from their sins, and He had obeyed. He healed the sick, cast out demons, and condemned the false leaders of His people; gave His life for the sins of all mankind so that all who would believe in Him could have Eternal Life. (John 5 24)

Historical records abound attesting to the life of Jesus. His life and death on earth are considered to be the most proven of all historical figures. **Before His arrest, Jesus prayed to the Father which included the following**:

- *First, He prayed for Himself:* That the Father would receive Him back into Heaven and restore the glory He had before the world began. (John 17:4-5)
- *Then He prayed for His Disciples:* That the Father would protect, guide and be with them as they delivered His message. (John 17:18)
- *Then he prayed for all Christians:* He prayed for each child of God to have the same unity as exists between He and the Father. A unity, which allows for the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, and oneness with God. (John 17:20-21)

Later that day Jesus was hung on a cross until dead. Near the point of death, He said with a loud voice, "It is finished!" (John 19:30). Upon His death, heaven and earth were shaken with violent earthquakes, and the earth was covered with darkness. People who had previously died were seen walking about, and the veil in the temple was torn from top to bottom. (Matt 27:51)

The torn veil was to signify that the Spirit of God would no longer reside in the back of the temple in the Most Holy of Holies place under the "Old Covenant." Now under the "New Covenant" the Spirit was placed in the heart of every born-again believer. The followers of Jesus are now His Tabernacle (His Church). (Luke 23:45, Matt 27:45-53)

Jesus had executed the mission given Him by His Father, and in doing so had opened the "Kingdom of Heaven" to all who would receive Him. He was the new Passover Lamb! Never again would there be a need for animal sacrifice. **The Lamb of God had shed His blood once and for all!** (The True Meaning of Easter continued) **Jesus had paid it all! His life, death, burial, and resurrection ushered in a new plan of Salvation for humanity.** This better and more perfect way was God's "New Covenant" with His people. Salvation and Eternal life were now available to anyone who would believe and accept Jesus as their Savior. Every time we take the bread & drink the cup of the New Covenant, we are proclaiming that Jesus is the Messiah, the Lamb of God, and Savior of the world.

The chief priests and Pharisee's had tried to stop the inevitable, but neither Roman soldiers, government seals, nor large stones could prevent the King of Kings and Lord of Lords from accomplishing His mission. Jesus is the true message of Easter, and Because Of Him mankind can have a relationship with their Creator and be with Him for eternity.

Easter brings hope, new beginnings, and Eternal Life, made possible by the One who loved us enough to die in our place, Jesus Christ. For much of the world, Easter is only a tradition celebrated by colored Easter eggs and the Easter bunny. But to the followers of Christ, the true message of Easter proclaims the greatest act of love known to man.

God's infinite love for humanity is the true message of Easter, a love that will continue into eternity. Amen.

Re-Opening the Rest of Union

As most of you know, only the main floor of Union Baptist has been open on Sundays for worship services. Property & Space Chair, Portia Fuller and her team, have kept this area cleaned, disinfected, and sanitized since March 2020. Hays Hall, the Nursery, Choir Room, Kitchen, and Bathrooms have been closed for the past two years. The only area open downstairs has been the Food Pantry. Upstairs on the 3rd floor, there has been no activity at all.

Sadly, closing these areas has had a significant impact on our youth as well as on the cleanliness of the church.

On March 15th, the ministry leaders over these areas met to discuss what it would take to reopen these areas of the church. Sister Fuller presented steps needed to accomplish these tasks – and they are extensive and somewhat costly. Many solutions were proposed, including engaging the services of professional organizations to perform several of these tasks to get God's House back in order. Unfortunately, these tasks must include more than just cleaning and sanitizing these areas. (Can you imagine abandoning several rooms in your house for two years?)

One area that takes priority is getting our Library back on track. That will take a group of people working together to get this done. Please let us know if you can help.

Funding of 165,000 for the Union Baptist Church Cemeteries Revitalization

This funding will support the Union Baptist Church's stewardship and revitalization of our two historic African American Cemeteries, Union Baptist Cemetery and United American Cemetery, as well as our historical documents.

U.S. Senator Sherrod Brown hosted a news conference call to discuss the introduction of his *African American Burial Grounds Preservation Act.* The newly-introduced bipartisan bill is also sponsored by U.S. Senator Mitt Romney.

Brown first introduced similar legislation in 2019 after **he visited Union Baptist Cemetery in Cincinnati** following news reports of vandalism at the cemetery and the cemetery's call for much-needed repairs.

"As a nation, we have not invested the necessary resources to preserve these hallowed grounds. That's why we've worked with the community, and with civil rights, veterans, and historic preservation groups to introduce bipartisan legislation to preserve historic Black burial grounds around the country," said Brown. "Cemeteries like Union Baptist are important historical sites, and they're tools for education and understanding the American story. We need to act now before these sites are lost to the ravages of time or development."

"Burial grounds are a place of solemn remembrance, allowing us to connect the present with the past and honor the history of our loved ones and communities," said Romney. "It is important to preserve and protect African-American cemeteries around the country for generations to come."

The *African American Burial Grounds Preservation Act*, would establish a program at the National Park Service to provide grant opportunities and technical assistance to local partners to research, identify, survey, and preserve these cemeteries. Providing federal resources will ensure sites like **Union Baptist** are preserved and maintained for future generations.

Brown was joined on the call by Jan-Michele Lemon Kearney, the Vice Mayor of Cincinnati.

"Cemeteries not only honor our ancestors, but the history of our communities. I am very grateful for Sen. Sherrod Brown for recognizing the need for care that our cemeteries require to show respect for and uplift our heritage," said Kearney.

The legislation is also supported by historic preservation groups in Ohio and across the country.
