A Meditation for You from Our Pastor

Living The Golden Rule

"So whatever you wish that others would do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets."

Matthew 7:12 (ESV)

I would like to take a moment to wish you a very Merry Christmas. During this advent season, we celebrate Hope, Peace, Love and Joy through Jesus Christ our Lord. I pray that all of these attributes will fill your life in every way this Christmas and beyond. I am grateful to God for all of His many blessings but most of all for the free gift of salvation. This Christmas, as in all previous years, we celebrate "Immanuel" (God with us). Without Christ's presence among us we would be lost. Through His presence working within us we are being healed, transformed, reconciled, and made whole. I pray you have a fantastic Christmas and a prosperous New Year!

Our message for this edition is based on The Golden Rule.

How you treat others can have a negative or positive affect on the other person but also on you. I have listed a few positive effects for your consideration. This is not meant to be a complete list.

Treat Others Justly

You wouldn't want people lying about you or falsely or harshly condemning you. Right?

Be Loyal to Friends and Companions

You would probably want your friends and companions to be loyal: you wouldn't want them to betray you.

Be a Good Sport

You would probably like to be treated with good sportsmanship and not hoodwinked nor tricked into doing things.

Treat Others Fairly and Honestly

You would want people to be fair in their dealings with you. You would want them to be honest and not cheat you. Correct?

Be Kind

You would want to be treated kindly, without cruelty nor spoken to in a demeaning harsh manner.

Be Considerate

When you are down, you might like others to be compassionate. We all have our 'valley' experiences.

Exhibit Self-Control

Instead of blasting you, you would probably want others to exhibit self-control. Right?

Be Tolerant and Forgiving

If you have defects or shortcomings, and we all do, if you make a mistake, you might want people to be tolerant, not critical. Rather than concentrating on retaliation or punishment, you would most likely prefer people to be forgiving. Correct?

Be Benevolent

You probably want people to be benevolent toward you in your time of need; not mean, stingy or gossiping.

Be Encouragers, Respectful, Polite and Treat Others with Dignity

You probably would want others to believe in you, not doubt you at every hand. You would probably prefer to be given respect, not insults. You would probably want others to be polite to you and also treat you with dignity. Right?

Admire Other People, Show Appreciation, Be Friendly and Loving

You might like others to admire and affirm you. When you do something for them, the group, or a good deed, you probably would like people to appreciate you. Correct? We know that all good gifts come from God, but most people, including you, need to feel appreciation. You probably would also like others to be friendly and there are times when we all need to feel that we are loved.

Exercise the Gift of Integrity

And above all, no one likes pretenders, you would want others to be real in their attitudes and act with integrity and truth!

Union Baptist Church along with Wreaths Across America will be remembering and honoring Civil War Veterans at the Union Baptist Cemetery on Saturday, December 17, 2022.

Union Baptist Cemetery is an African American Cemetery and is on the National Register of Historic Places. There are 121 Civil War Heroes buried at the cemetery.

The goal this year is to honor **50 Civil War Veterans** laid to rest in December with a Remembrance wreath and the goal of 50 wreaths has been surpassed.

In 1862, the first Watch Night Service was celebrated in Black communities in America. The Watch Night service can be traced back to gatherings known as "Freedom's Eve." On that night, Black slaves and free Blacks came together in churches and private homes all across the nation, awaiting news that the Emancipation Proclamation had become law. Lincoln had used the occasion of the Union victory at Antietam to issue a preliminary proclamation, which freed all slaves in the rebellious states after January 1, 1863.

Blacks (in particular) have gathered in churches annually on New Year's Eve ever since, praising God for bringing us safely through another year. It's been over a century and a half since the first Freedom's Eve, and tradition still brings citizens together at this time every year to celebrate "how we got over."
