

The 2025 Martin Luther King Jr. Day March and Program is extra special this year because of the celebration of the program's 50th year. The theme is "Jubilee for MLK's Beloved Community."

The morning will start with a morning of music, reflection and call to action in celebration of the life and enduring legacy of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. at the Annual MLK Breakfast held at the National Underground Railroad Freedom Center located at 50 East Freedom Way (45202). ### **Her Grant: United Colored American Cemetery**

We will have an update in January about the \$750,000 NPS grant. We are excited about moving forward with our restoration projects at United Colored American. This spring, we will also have a ceremony for the installation of our historical marker. Again, special thanks to the Councilman, Mark Jefferies, and the City of Cincinnati for helping us with this project.

### **Archival Staff**

Elizabeth Coleman from the Ohio America Corp Program will collaborate with Schroder and JP Parker School on a series of events and lectures about the United Colored American Cemetery and will also be involved in our archival work.

Rachel Powell and Etta Cole are student workers from the University of Cincinnati who also work with Carolyn Davis on Saturdays. These three individuals have been gifted to us. Union Baptist does not pay their salaries; our partners have picked up their wages for this archival project.

### **Archival Work and Move**

We will move upstairs to the newly renovated Archival room in the next few weeks. We are still digitizing our records with the public library. The Cemetery Advisory Board has been actively engaged in our archival work; we highly appreciate their recommendations and support for our cemetery work.

### **Greater Cincinnati Foundation**

Congratulations, Union. The Greater Cincinnati Foundation has awarded us a \$19,000 Environmental Grant for work at Union Baptist Cemetery. We will begin this work in January 2025 and be able to cut down and remove dead trees and fix sunken graves and potholes.


Scriptures Ministry is based on:

Origins

Black educators and the Black United Students at Kent State University proposed Black History Month in February 1969. The first celebration took place at Kent State in February 1970.

Early years

The celebration was initially a week-long event, but was expanded to a month in the 1960s during the Civil Rights movement.

Official recognition

In 1976, President Gerald Ford officially designated February as Black History Month. Since then, every U.S. president has officially designated the month.

Celebration

Black History Month is celebrated in the United States and Canada, and more recently in Ireland and the United Kingdom.

Purpose

Black History Month is a celebration of African Americans' achievements and their role in U.S. history. It's also a reminder that Black history and achievement can be celebrated by everyone all year long. ~ *Wikipedia*
